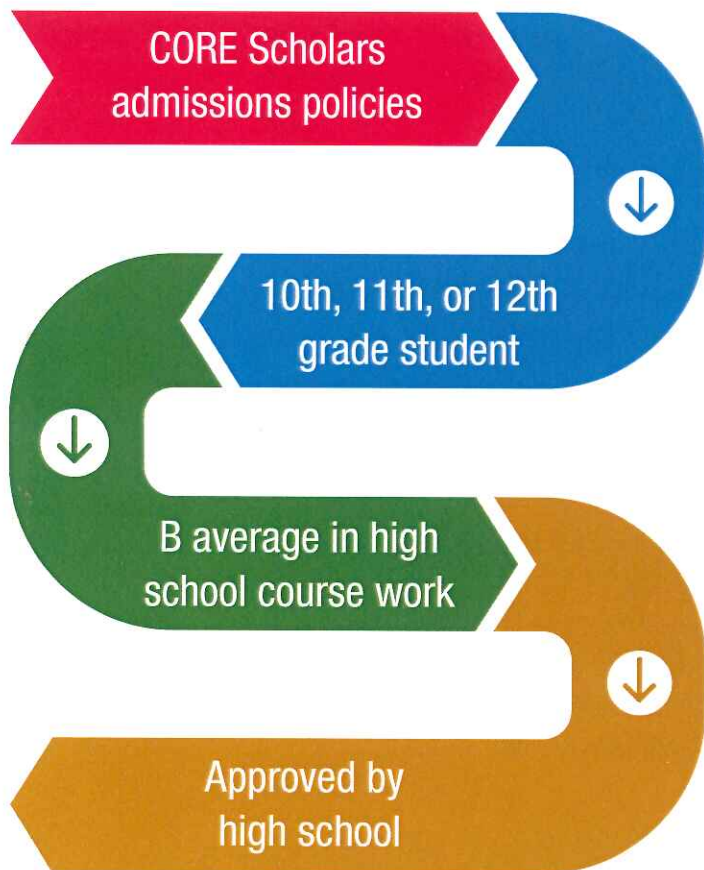




JSU CORE Scholars Dual Enrollment

Course Delivery Options

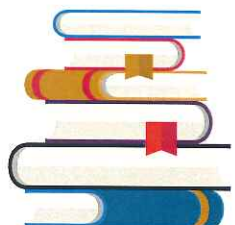
1. **Concurrent Enrollment**- offered on the high school campus during the school day
2. **Dual Enrollment**- offered online or on JSU campus

Dual enrollment can be an **entry point** for secondary students preparing themselves to enter the **workforce** or a **post-secondary school**. CORE **scholarships** are available for CORE **partner schools** for fall semester of 2018.

CORE Scholars Student Summer Workshops

A workshop designed to put dual enrollment success at the fingertips of students. Topics covered include MyJSU, Blackboard, GEM, as well as collegiate information. Visit the CORE Scholars webpage for more information and dates.

- All courses are taught by JSU faculty
- All CORE Scholars options involve receiving both college and high school credit
- Students take the college course in place of the high school course
- CORE Scholars is open to students of public schools, private schools, and homeschooled
- No fee for applying to the CORE Scholars program
