We know finding and applying for scholarships can be hard work. With the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM), it has never been easier.

Through AUSOM, you can view available scholarships you may be eligible to receive, complete scholarship applications, accept your awards, and more.

Incoming students accepted for admission must complete the scholarship application through AUSOM by midnight CST on February 10* to receive consideration for Freshman and General Scholarships awarded by the Office of University Scholarships, as well as Departmental Scholarships awarded by Auburn's colleges and schools.

Current Auburn students must complete the scholarship application through AUSOM by midnight CST on March 1 to receive consideration for General and Departmental Scholarships. Students accepted into the Nursing or Veterinary Medicine professional program or enrolled in the Pharmacy professional program should apply through AUSOM by midnight CST on June 1 to receive Departmental Scholarship consideration.

Students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**, available online January 1 at fafsa.ed.gov. The FAFSA must be received by March 1 for consideration of need-based scholarships.

* Incoming students planning to apply for scholarships should complete the admission application with all application materials received by January 15 to ensure sufficient notification time as well as time to complete the scholarship application in advance of the deadline.

Scholarship Consideration

Incoming students accepted for admission must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by midnight CST on February 10 to receive consideration for Freshman and General Scholarships awarded by the Office of University Scholarships, as well as Departmental Scholarships awarded by Auburn's colleges and schools. Students planning to apply for scholarships must complete the admission application with all required materials received by the January 15 application for admission priority deadline. Students who elect to test after the December ACT and SAT test dates are advised Auburn University cannot guarantee scores will be received and processed by the scholarship application deadline. Students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available online January 1 at fafsa.ed.gov. The FAFSA should be received by March 1 for consideration of need-based scholarships or April 1 for consideration of all other financial aid opportunities. National Scholars

National Merit Finalists and National Achievement Finalists receive a National Scholars Presidential Scholarship that includes:

- › Tuition for four years
- › \$1,000 technology stipend in the first fall semester
- › On-campus housing stipend for one year*
- › \$2,500 enrichment experience stipend available for one semester after the second year for study abroad or undergraduate research
- › \$4,000-\$8,000 stipend over four years (\$1,000-\$2,000 per year), depending on eligibility as determined by National Merit Scholarship Corporation and financial need as determined through completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

A National Scholars Presidential Scholarship replaces a Spirit of Auburn Scholarship if previously awarded.

National Merit and Achievement Finalists must have a minimum 3.5 high school GPA and meet the January 15 application for admission priority deadline.

National Merit Finalists must name Auburn as their first choice institution with National Merit Scholarship Corporation by May 1.

National Achievement Finalists should provide a copy of their notification letter to the Office of University Scholarships through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by May 1.

Alabama National Merit and Achievement Semifinalists who have a minimum 3.5 high school GPA and meet the January 15 application for admission priority deadline receive a Spirit of Auburn Founders Scholarship, replacing a Freshman Scholarship of lesser value if previously awarded.

*Housing application required. Housing availability and assignments determined by the Department of University Housing.

Spirit of Auburn Scholarships

Four-year, renewable scholarships are awarded at three levels beginning in October to Alabama students with a minimum 28 ACT or 1250 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA. Students must have the minimum test score and high school GPA required for consideration at each level.

Presidential Scholarship

- › Requires a 33-36 ACT (1440-1600 SAT) score and a minimum 3.5 high school GPA.
- › Awarded at tuition for four years.

Founders Scholarship

- › Requires a 30-32 ACT (1330-1430 SAT) score and a minimum 3.5 high school GPA.
- › Awarded at \$32,000 over four years (\$8,000 per year).

University Scholarship

- › Requires a 28-29 ACT (1250-1320 SAT) score and a minimum 3.5 high school GPA.
- › Awarded at \$16,000 over four years (\$4,000 per year).

Achievement Scholarship

Requires a minimum 26 ACT or 1170 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA for consideration.

Students who have previously been recognized by the Office of University Scholarships with a Freshman Scholarship of equal or greater value are ineligible for consideration.

Awarded in late February at \$8,000 over four years (\$2,000 per year).

All Auburn Scholarship

Requires a minimum 26 ACT or 1170 SAT score and a 3.5 high school GPA for consideration.

Students who have previously been recognized by the Office of University Scholarships with a Freshman Scholarship of equal or greater value are ineligible for consideration.

Awarded in late February at \$8,000 over four years (\$2,000 per year).

Ever to Conquer Scholarship

Requires a minimum 22 ACT or 1040 SAT score and a 3.0 high school GPA for consideration.

Priority consideration will be given to students who qualify for the Federal Pell Grant by March 1 through completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*. Consideration may also be given to students who

demonstrate a strong likelihood to qualify for the Federal Pell Grant through a combination of other factors.

Awarded between February and April at \$20,000 over four years (\$5,000 per year).

Provost Leadership Undergraduate Scholarship (PLUS)

Students must be a United States citizen or permanent resident, have a minimum 3.25 high school GPA, complete the FAFSA, and complete a PLUS application, including a 300-400 word diversity essay and teacher or counselor letter of recommendation, to receive consideration.

Priority consideration is given to students who are first-generation college students, demonstrate financial need, are Alabama residents, and have a diverse background, as determined by the goals of the Auburn University Strategic Diversity Plan.

The application is available online through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) in October with a February 10 deadline (by midnight CST).

Awarded in early April at \$8,000 over four years (\$2,000 per year) by the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Affairs.

Board of Trustees Scholarship

Requires a minimum 3.0 high school GPA and financial need demonstrated through completion of the FAFSA. Priority consideration will be given to students who qualify for the Federal Pell Grant.

Awarded in early April at \$1,500 for one year.

General Scholarships

Require a minimum 3.0 high school GPA for consideration.

Criteria vary, including, but not limited to, geographic location as defined by city, county, or state of residence and/or high school attended, academic achievement, and financial need.

Awarded in early April, and the award amounts vary.

Departmental Scholarships

Requirements for consideration vary by college and school.

Criteria vary, including, but not limited to, academic major, geographic location, academic achievement, and financial need.

Awarded in early April, and the award amounts vary.

Important Notes

Minimum academic requirements for scholarship consideration and award amounts are for students planning to enroll Summer or Fall 2016 and are subject to change for enrollment in future terms.

For the purposes of awarding scholarships, the highest composite ACT or total SAT score from a single test date is used, and the writing score is not considered.

Scholarships are awarded competitively, and consideration does not guarantee a scholarship will be awarded unless otherwise stated.

Tuition scholarship values are based on current tuition rates and will automatically adjust if rates change.

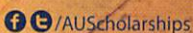

Incoming students accepted for admission must complete the scholarship application through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) by midnight CST on February 10* to receive consideration for Freshman and General Scholarships awarded by the Office of University Scholarships, as well as Departmental Scholarships awarded by Auburn's colleges and schools.

Current Auburn students must complete the scholarship application through AUSOM by midnight CST on March 1 to receive consideration for General and Departmental Scholarships. - Respond to all scholarship offers by the date requested on individual award notifications.
