## Additional Information

The JSU Office of Student Financial Services contacts you regarding your financial aid through your JSU GEM Email account and messages posted on your active messages page on MyJSU. Please check both systems regularly for up to date information.

Students may qualify for more than one institutionally funded award. Under no circumstances will multiple institutional awards result in a cash payment to the student. All tuition scholarships are at the in-state rate. Full tuition is up to 16 hours per semester and each hour is computed at the traditional classroom tuition rate. University housing is valued at the Double Occupancy Housing rate. Meal plans are valued at the On-Campus Resident rate and are available at the Jack Hopper Dining Hall.

# Exceptional Value

# Priority deadline for Federal Aid is March 15, 2014

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (www.fafsa.gov) contains questions pertaining to the student's assets, income, college hours earned, etc. Students who are dependent on their parents, based on Federal Student Aid guidelines, must also submit information concerning parental income, assets, and other items. Financial aid filing and processing information can be found at www.jsu.edu/finaid. If you list the JSU Title IV school code (001020), the federal processor will send your processed student aid report to JSU.

# Types of Aid

## Grants

Grants are gifts based on need and do not have to be repaid.

## Loans

USU participates in the Federal Direct Loan Program. There are three types of Federal Direct Student Loans: Subsidized, Unsubsidized and Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS).
