

Candidates must meet the following requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- 15-18 years of age at the start of the NSLI-Y program
- Enrolled in high school at the time of application
- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- Additional criteria detailed in the application

Previous language study is not required. NSLI-Y seeks applicants representing the diversity of the United States, including students with disabilities.
